We look forward to welcoming you in person when you arrive on campus. By now, you've likely had a chance to explore the housing and meal plan information we sent as part of your *Getting Started* packet. **Still have questions about living at UAF? We want you to benefit as much as possible from all that the residence halls offer.

Where should I live?

To help you select the living situation that works best for you consider your preferences. The residence hall application includes questions about your living habits, including whether you prefer to get up early or stay up late and whether you smoke. Answer those questions honestly so you're matched up with a compatible roommate. The sooner you let us know what you'd like, the greater your chances of getting the best possible match. Remember, if you're requesting a roommate, each of you should name the other on your residence hall applications and you should both send in the forms at about the same time.

Moore, Skarland and MacLean halls are for freshmen only. Bartlett, Moore and Skarland have a convenience store and a common recreation center. The Cutler Student Apartments and Wickersham Hall are only for upper-division undergraduates and graduate students and offer roomier quarters. They are also on-campus options that don't require a meal plan. If you're looking for family housing, contact Residence Life for the necessary application.

All single student housing agreements require purchase of a UAF board plan at a cost of \$1,295-\$1,485 per semester. Exceptions are Wickersham and Cutler residents and all graduate students.

How do I pick a meal plan?

Some things to consider as you choose a meal plan are: How likely are you to want breakfast in the morning? Do you enjoy preparing meals with friends? How stressful will it be to budget your Munch Money throughout the semester? Meal plan meals are redeemed in the Lola Tilly Commons during meal times, while Munch Money can be used just about any time at the Wood Center and other campus locations. At the Commons, you eat all you want for the price of one meal. When you use Munch Money, you pay for individual items, just as you would with cash. If you expect to stay on campus during school breaks, keep in mind that because the Commons will be closed, you will only be able to use Munch Money—not buy meals—during those times. You can change your meal plan if the one you select doesn't work out, but you must do so in writing during the first 10 days of the semester.

EDGE: Education, Development, Growth and Experience

Your first year at UAF can be the most important year of your college experience. All first-time freshmen (age 20 and under) with fewer than 20 semester post-high school credits who elect to live on campus live in our EDGE halls. EDGE halls are MacLean, Moore and Skarland. EDGE is designed to help you make connections with the university through academics, campus activities and residence hall programs that enrich the college experience. EDGE offers additional staff, student groups, tutoring and social academic events to help you prepare for success in college and beyond.

To help you acclimate to college life, all EDGE residents are required to enroll in Orientation UAF.
