

University of Alaska Fairbanks Transfer Credit Legend

When viewing your transfer credit equivalency report, you will find the Subject, Number, Title and credits of the course taken at your school listed alphabetically to the left side of the report. Listed to the **right**, is the Subject, Number, Title and credits of the equivalent course at the University of Alaska Fairbanks.

Term indicates the term for which the course was evaluated at UAF. Term appears in a year/semester format. The first four characters are the **year**, followed by the **semester**, where

01 = Spring **02** = Summer **03** = Fall

Group indicates grouped courses, where two or more courses are grouped together to equal one or more courses at UAF. A transfer course with a group code must be combined with another transfer course(s) of the same group code to be equivalent to a UAF course(s). A course taken as part of a sequence may be evaluated differently than the same course taken alone. In the example above BI 101 and 102 **together** satisfy BIOL F115X at UAF. Math for Engineers will satisfy **both** UAF courses: MATH F107X **and** MATH F108.

Credits at UAF are expressed in semester units. If you are transferring from a quarter system, you may need to complete two quarters of a subject to receive credit for one semester of that course. Year long subjects that are three quarters will equate to two semesters at UAF. The general rule is that 1 quarter hour is equal to 0.667 semester hours; or, a quarter hour class of 5 credits equals 3.335 semester credits.

Course Numbers at UAF begin with the letter **F** (Fairbanks). Three digit codes indicate the award of a UAF course, while one digit codes represent an elective or core substitution.

The first digit represents the course level.

1=freshman **2** = sophomore **3** = junior **4** = senior

A Suffix to the course number indicates the discipline for the course.

S = Social Sciences **H** = Humanities **N** = Natural Sciences (no lab) **L** = Lab only
NL = Natural Sciences with lab **X** = Core curriculum course or substitute **M** = Mathematics

Core Substitutes are awarded when the course from the transfer institution does not match a specific UAF core course. The substitute does fulfill the UAF core requirement.

Grades earned for courses at your previous school do not transfer to your UAF GPA; however, they are considered when computing your eligibility for honors at the time of graduation.
