

**Pronouns**

shih	'I', 'me'	neexon	'we', 'us'
nen	'you'	nuhxon	'you all'
nâan	'that one' ('she', 'he')	nâan iin	'those ones', 'they', 'them'

**Plural *iin***

Following a noun referring to people it may indicate plural, more than one.

dendeh	'man'
dendeey iin	'men'
ts'éhxeeey	'woman'
ts'éhxeeey iin	'women'
dóo?	'who?'
dóo iin?	'who all?'

With objects it may mean 'among other things', especially in a list.

Eek iin éł, ch'ehtlé' iin éł, kentsiith iin éł nádzélshaa.  
 'We're wearing shirts, pants, and shoes, among other things.'

**Contrastive focus *dú'***

Follows a noun phrase to indicate contrast, 'as for ...'

shih dú',	as for me,
nen dú',	as for you,
nen dú'?	how about you?
ts'éhxeeey iin dú',	as for the women,
ts'éhxeeey iin ěeg' dú',	as for the womens' shirts,

**Distibutive *ná-***

Sometimes when we are referring to more than one person doing something we want to emphasize that they are doing the actions individually rather than as a whole. For example, when a group of people is sitting, we may wish to emphasize the fact that they are each sitting on their own individual chair rather than all together on one chair. This can be achieved with the *distributive ná-* inserted into the left side of the verb.

tthee xahshóg déedlah	rocks are lying on the ground
tthee xahshóg nádéedlah	rocks are lying scattered about on the ground

## Phrases

Wu'ëeg' nts'é éłtsii?

What does his shirt look like?  
(What color is his shirt?)

Nee'ëeg' nts'é ná'éłtsii?

What do our shirts look like?  
(What color are our shirts?)

Ts'éhxeey iin dú' nuh'ëeg' nádéłt'eł,  
êy gha tl'âan neexon dú' ëeg' deldlêedz  
nádzelshah.

As for the women, your shirts are red,  
and as for us, we are wearing blue shirts.

Nts'é xetde'e?

What are they doing?

Dinádzelth'ih.

We're sitting.

Díi nádzelshah.

What are we all wearing?

Kentsiith nts'é éłtsiin shíi nádzel'éetth?

What color shoes are we wearing?

Neekentsiidh' nts'é ná'éłtsii?

What color are our shoes?

Neexon dú', neekentsiidh' déłtthox,  
tl'âan nuhxon dú', kentsiith delgaay  
shíi nádédhal'éetth.

As for us, our shoes are brown, and as for you  
guys, you're wearing white shoes.

Taag ts'elt'eh ts'í' neekentsiidh' déłtthox.

The three of us have brown shoes.

Sh'él stadaxdédháh'aa.

You all have really confused me.

Medhildax?

Did you forget it?

K'áhmén dá'a ghihsháatth?

Did it snow this morning?

Aa, ghihsháatth.

Yes, it snowed.

Nnaa ndée éedah?

Where does your mother live?

Na'andég shnaa eedah.

Mother lives way up there in.

Na'andég deshax eedah.

Her house is way up there.

Nahshóg díi xédéedlah?

What all lying there on the ground?

Tuutiil' éł xeel' éł nahshóg xédéedlah.

A cup and a pack are lying on the ground

L̥saaz nahshóg xénádéedlah.

There's money scattered on the ground.

Shnandeddh díi ée'aa?

What (compact object) is in front of me?

K'etl'adíidaay shnandeddh ée'aa.

There's a chair sitting in front of me.

Kón'teg shnandeddh xun̥lee.

The doorway is in front of me.

Shghahdóg. Shghahshóg.

From me up. From me down.

Tenáts'atdek.

We're each tired.
