Phrases

Nxú' nts'é nt'eh?

How are your teeth?

Shxú' nsu.

My teeth are fine.

Teddh dé' t'êey tishndah,
t'aaan k'áhmén' dé' ch'e tihteel.

Tonight I work again,
then tomorrow morning I will sleep.

Teddh uudíh etdah.

He work all night long.

Neexon dú' teddh uudíh ts'ahteets.

As for us, we sleep all night.

Shih dú' teddh dé' tihteel.

As for me, I will sleep tonight

Teejuh k'á eynithén.

He doesn't feel sorry.

Ndlaan iin taadél?

Are lots of people coming?

More singular and plural verbs

Notice the difference between one sleeping and more than one sleeping.

dhiht̚e̚	I am sleeping
dhint̚e̚	you are sleeping
eet̚e̚	he or she is sleeping
ts'ehteets	we are sleeping
ahteets	you all are sleeping
xeheteets	they are sleeping
