Hatchery Worker Description:

Hatcheries hire for a vareity of different jobs. Alaska hosts a number of fish hatcheries and one shellfish hatchery. Hatchery workers assist in the process of raising organisms through all levels of their life cylce and also releasing organisms when necessary. A hatchery worker will do a lot of work outdoors and near water. Hatchery managers direct and coordinate the activities of the hatchery. They also consult with biologists and other experts while making sure the hatchery meets all requirements.
