SPRING GRADUATES

If you expect to finish your degree in the spring semester, you must complete a Graduation Application and pay the graduation application fee. The form is available at the Office of the Registrar or at www.uaf.edu/reg/forms/graduation.pdf. The last day to apply for Spring 2010 graduation is Feb. 15.

All work for Spring '10 graduates must be completed by May 6 to allow time for your instructor to grade all your assignments and exams. The Graduation Office **MUST** be notified if you are unable to meet this deadline! The phone number for the Graduation Office is 907-474-7523; e-mail is graduation@uaf.edu.

About CDE courses

The Center for Distance Education offers over 135 independent learning courses guided by your instructor. Some of the courses are offered as web-based, and some are offered as traditional print-based correspondence. You may register in these classes as either a Semester-Based (using UAOnline) or as a Yearlong student (CDE web site). If you choose to take the class as a semester-based course, you must complete the course within the semester time frame.

A list of semester-based courses is included on the next several pages. If you are interested in registering for a full-year course (where you aren't committed to the semester's length) a list of full-year Independent Learning courses is available from the CDE office at 2175 University Avenue South, Fairbanks, AK, online at <http://distance.uaf.edu> or by calling CDE at (907) 479-3444 or (800) 277-8060.

Semester-based versus full-year courses

Semester-based course	Year-long course
Registration is possible only during the formal registration period. There is no registration for semester-based distance learning courses beyond the last day to enroll for regular campus semester-length courses.	Registration is possible any time during the year. All rules applicable to regular semester course grading apply. Students are required to complete the distance learning course by the CDE semester deadline date (this date is before the end of the UAF semester). If you do not, an Incomplete ("I") may be given at the discretion of the instructor if the student has completed at least half of the lessons and has a grade of "C" or better in the course. At the end of the agreed-upon time extension, the instructor must assign a letter grade (A-F). If the instructor does not assign a letter grade, the "I" will automatically change to an "F" after one year.	A student has a full year to complete the course. If the course is not completed, but the student has completed at least half the lessons with a grade of "C" or better, one extension may be granted. At the end of the extension, the instructor must assign a letter grade (A-F).
The course counts in both the semester and the cumulative GPA.	The course counts only in the cumulative GPA for purposes of graduation.
A semester-based distance learning course is counted as UAF residence credit.	The full-year distance learning course is counted as UAF residence credit.
In general, students may complete the course at their own pace within the semester timeframe. However, some instructors have established lesson-completion goals throughout the semester which must be met. Students may finish courses in less than a semester.	Students may complete the course at their own pace within the year. They may finish the course in less than a year; grades will be posted as soon as the course is completed.
Faculty may withdraw students from the course before the 10th week if sufficient work has not been accomplished. A "W" appears on the transcript. The "W" is not computed in the student's GPA, although it could affect financial aid.	Students may be withdrawn after seven months if there has been insufficient progress in the course. A "W" appears on the transcript. The "W" is not computed in the student's GPA.

When you register into a US or UX section of a course, your textbooks and other materials will automatically be mailed to you from the CRCD Bookstore during the book mailing period

at the mailing address you indicated on your registration. The fees for these books and materials will automatically be added to your student account. For information on the cost of books and materials, call the CRCD Bookstore at 1-877-651-4002.

Print-Based Courses

US sections – print-based semester courses

If you enroll in a course with a US section, this designates the course as a traditional print-based correspondence course. You will receive a printed course guide which will explain what to do for each lesson. You will write out the lesson requirements and send them to our office either by mail using the prepaid envelopes that you will receive with your course guide, or fax to (907) 479-3443, or by e-mail to ralesson@uaf.edu (unless your course guide says to send them directly to the instructor). You will then receive your graded lesson back either by mail or by e-mail, depending on the course and instructor.

Web-Based Courses

UX Sections – Web-based semester courses

If you enroll in a course with a UX section, this designates the course as being delivered by the Internet through the World Wide Web. You are required to have reliable access to the Internet in order to complete your course. Most courses use a learning management system called Blackboard. To access the course material on Blackboard, go to <http://classes.uaf.edu>. If your course(s) uses Blackboard and you have used Blackboard in a previous class you will automatically be added to the new course. Your username and password will remain unchanged.

If your course uses Blackboard, but you have not been enrolled in a Blackboard class before, there will be additional steps for you to do before you can begin the course work. Detailed instructions for accessing Blackboard will be included with your course materials but if you want to get started early, please see <http://classes.uaf.edu/> for instructions. If you have any problems with this process, please contact support@classes.uaf.edu.
