## ABOUT KUSKOKWIM CAMPUS (KuC)

### Welcome

KuC in Bethel offers on-campus and distance delivered programs leading to certificates, AAS/AA degrees, and BA/MA degrees. More courses are listed in the DISTANCE DELIVERED section at the front of this schedule.

Unique to KuC is Sackett Hall, an on-campus student housing and dining facility. KuC also provides other services to Bethel and the region, including a **Continuing Education/Professional Development Department** and the **Yup'it Piciryarait Cultural Center (YPCC)**. YPCC houses a conference center, a consortium library and a museum.

KuC serves 46 villages with 56 tribes in the lower delta regions of the Yukon and Kuskokwim rivers. Inhabited predominately by people of the Yup'ik/Cup'ik language and culture, the regions have a population of nearly 25,000 people in the villages, with 6,000 in the City of Bethel.

KuC has been designated an Alaska Native Serving Institution by the United States Department of Education and is the recipient of a DOE Title III grant designed to foster new and innovative educational services and programs for the Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta, as well as DOE grants to renovate the laboratory and the main campus building.

In 2008 the Kuskokwim Campus became the first rural campus to offer a bachelor's degree; the Yup'ik Language and Culture program. In Yup'ik the program is *Yup'it Nakmiin Qaneryaraat Piciryaraat-Illu*. It strives to reinforce a Yup'ik identity, prepare students for success in the world, and leads to acceptance at home. It is based on a philosophy that a strong command of the Yup'ik language leads to a complete understanding of the Yup'ik way of life, the world around us and our place in it. Students are encouraged to complete a minor in Education of Alaska Native and Rural Development. To date 20 students are enrolled and working toward graduation.

## Educational talent search

The goal of Educational Talent Search (ETS) is to work with Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta middle and high school students to increase enrollment and graduation rates in post-secondary education. The core of the program is a series of activity-filled summer college camps geared towards the college experience. Students stay one week in the dormitory and participate in camp activities and learn that they are capable of achieving a college degree. Additionally, high achieving juniors and seniors can earn acceptance into the Alaska Native Science and Engineering Program (ANSEP) Summer Field Science Camp at Nash Harbor on Nunivak Island. E-Live Note for Courses: Some KuC courses deliver portions using interactive software called Elluminate Live (E-Live). They will be held through two-way audio and sharing of program applications and graphics. Students are required to have basic

computer skills and Internet access for class sessions. This can be dial-up access. Administrative Access to the computer is needed to download the software. Requires: Windows, MAC, or UNIX Computer (less than 3 years old) with 64 MB RAM, and sound card with Microsoft Office (Word & Excel) installed; computer headsets (headphones with microphone) to be purchased with the books. Audio numbers are also used for emergency back-up. Students must contact the instructor before the course starts and download software so they will be prepared for the first class.
