



#### Alaska's research university

UAF is among the top 7% of U.S. research universities. One of UAF's strategic goals is to achieve Carnegie R1 status, which will have wide-ranging positive impacts on UAF, the UA system and Alaska's economy. In FY23, each state general fund dollar allocated to UAF research generated \$8.80 in revenue from other sources.

#### **Economic development**

UAF received \$25.8 million in state one-time funding for research and workforce development in areas with high potential for growth: critical minerals and rare earth elements, unmanned aerial vehicle systems, mariculture, and heavy oil and gas recovery.
