There is nothing quite like a properly sharpened tool. It makes life easier and safer, greatly reduces frustration and yields a much better product. We will cover sharpening of saws, planes, chisels, scrapers, cutters with shapes, and carving tools. You will learn how to fix a damaged tool or reshape or make a new tool.

What you should bring:

- Safety glasses and hearing protection
- A variety of woodworking tools to tune up and sharpen (chisels, planes, spokeshaves, handsaws, scrapers, carving tools, draw knives, axes, etc.)
- At least one good sharpening stone as well as whatever other sharpening supplies you have (hones, strops, jigs, compounds, etc.)
- If you don’t have a good stone, then I would suggest a diamond stone. 8” is a perfect size and extra fine is essential for a very sharp tool.
