Describe State of Alaska and United States natural resources laws, regulations, and management systems impacting Tribal Stewardship in Alaska; 4. Describe how, when, and where to participate in State of Alaska and United States management systems of fish and wildlife to promote traditional ways of life, including providing effective participation and testimony; and 5. Identify introductory concepts and tools in developing successful contemporary Tribal Natural Resource Stewardship programs in Alaska.	1.
