GOAL STATEMENT: The Licensed Practical Nurse program will educate and prepare students to pass the NCLEX-PN and join the healthcare workforce as a Licensed professional. Allied Health faculty have worked with Industry Partners to meet their workforce needs throughout the interior and rural areas of Alaska.	1. On-Time Program Completion – 80% of students that start the nursing program on the first day will graduate on time.	Compare the number of students at the start of the program with the number of graduates completing the program. Conduct exit interviews to identify reasons for student disenrollment from the program.	The Nurse Administrator will meet individually with each student at the end of each semester to assess performance, progress, and address any concerns for program completion.
	2. 1 st Time Pass Rate NCLEX-PN – 80% of graduates will pass NCLEX-PN on the first attempt.	NCLEX-PN testing dates and results will be tracked by the LPN program.	Director of the LPN program will track all students to verify and document the date the test is taken and results. The NCLEX-PN examination fee for the first attempt will be included in student course fees.
	3. Overall NCLEX Pass Rate – 80% of graduates will pass NCLEX-PN within first 12 months of eligibility.	% of those students taking and passing NCLEX-PN will be documented and filed.	Director of the LPN program will track all students to verify and document test dates and pass rates.
	4. Job Placement Rate – 80% of graduates will be employed as an LPN within 9 months of program completion.	Outcomes are based on student self-report. The Nurse Administrator will document response rate and job placement rates from student responses. If the student responds, the Nurse Administrator will document date of hire, location, and position.	The Nurse Administrator will document the student's phone number and (non-edu) email address prior to program completion. Following a reported NCLEX-PN pass, the Nurse Administrator will reach out on a quarterly basis for status of employment, to include date of hire, location, and position.
