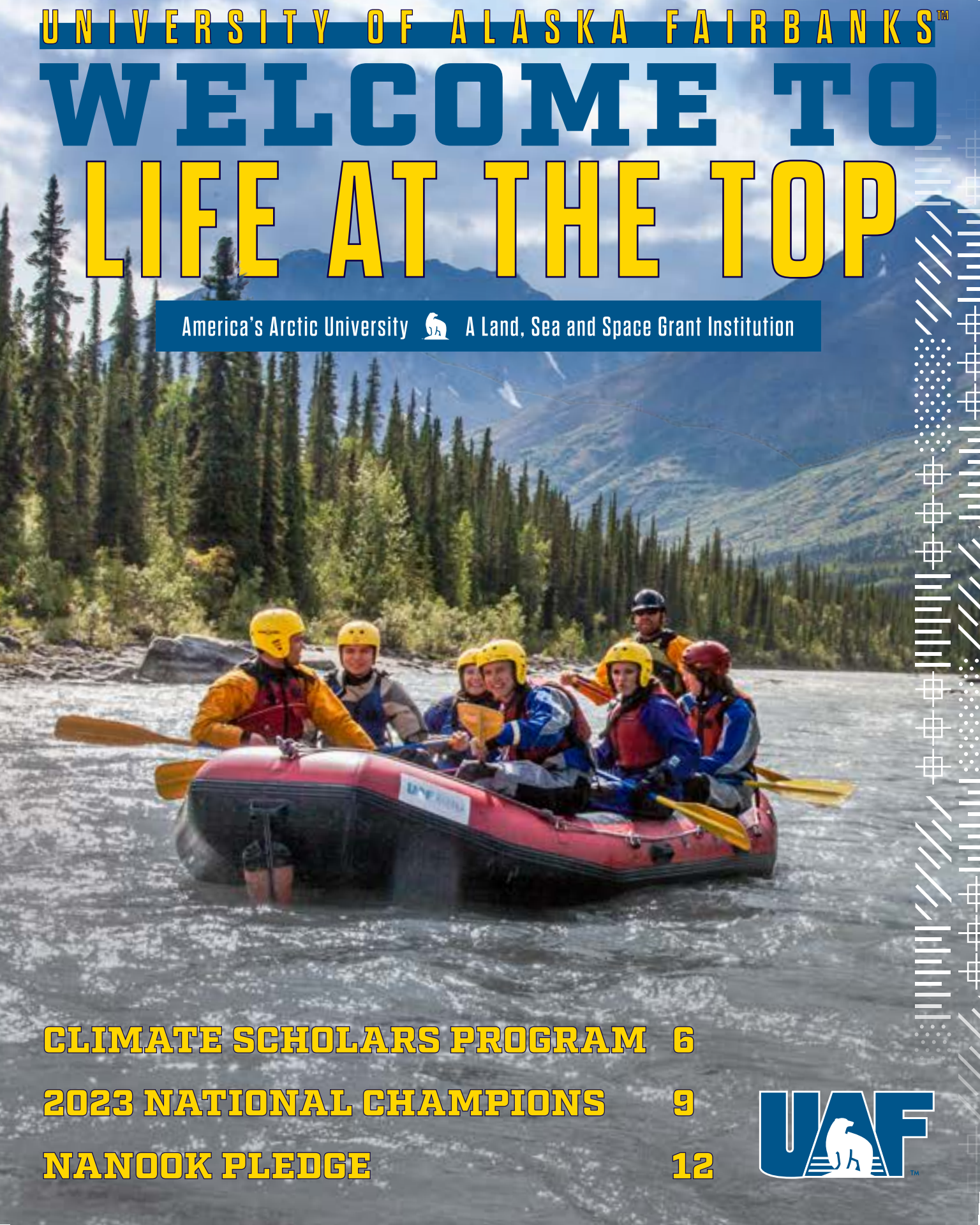

MOODY P. ART & PSYCHOLOGY DOUBLE MAJOR

In spring 2023, Moody sat in a UAF coffee shop, listening to the campus radio station playing on the café speakers. Suddenly, they had an idea.

Moody opened their laptop, hit a few keys and selected a song. Within moments, their own music choice filled the café, and Moody knew they were on to something. "I felt I was like in a hacker movie or something," they said.

It wasn't a hack, though. Moody chooses the music themselves often – they're the production director at KSUA, the student-run radio station at UAF. The station's modern, fully digital operation allows such remote control of the playlist.

Moody is an art and psychology double major, and both volunteered and worked as a DJ at the station for a few years before becoming production director.

Born and raised in Fairbanks, Moody enrolled at UAF after graduating from high school in 2016. But they took a break for a few years before coming back to finish their degrees.

"UAF is a pretty nontraditional school, there's people from all different stages in their life here," they said. "**And IT'S HELPED ME FEEL, LIKE, NOT OUT OF PLACE HERE.**"

Jaiden, who grew up in Fairbanks, has "never seen a real beach before." But even though she pondered Hawaii for college, she didn't feel the need.

"I JUST LOVE IT HERE SO MUCH THAT I DON'T WANT TO GO ANYWHERE ELSE," she said while sitting in the Murie Building's glass lobby on a bright February day. "Like right now, it's really sunny and you can see the mountain ranges from here."

The third-year UAF student, who home-schooled for her entire K-12 education, nevertheless sees broader horizons.

Building on a family connection to Germany, she has taken multiple courses in that nation's language. She participates in the German Club and works as a teaching assistant for beginning classes.

"I would really love to go to Germany. I've thought about going on an exchange," she said.

Jaiden also hopes to attend veterinary school, perhaps through UAF's program, after she earns her biology degree.

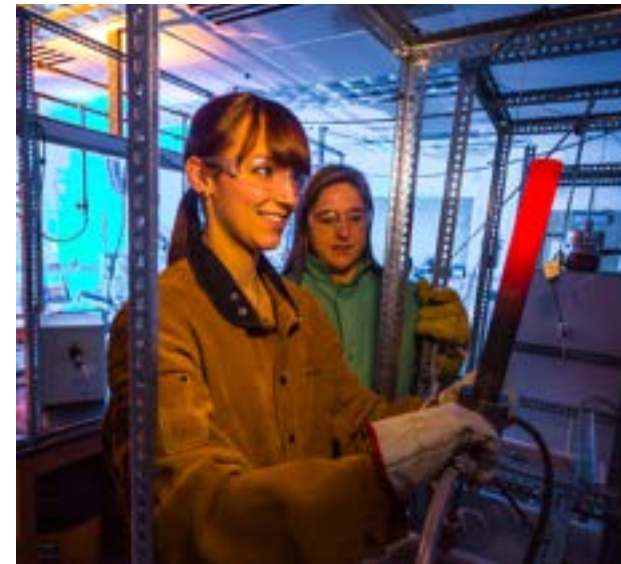

FINDING COMMUNITY AND COMBATING CLIMATE CHANGE.

RIVER S. INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES MAJOR

Just days after his Navy discharge in June 2021, River was in Alaska, following up on his interest in visiting the state. He thought he would try out college for a semester.

Two years later, he has experienced far more of Alaska than he could have imagined.

"That's what's been cool about UAF," he said. "It's allowed me to see more of Alaska than I thought I would."

River, an interdisciplinary studies major, joined **UAF's Climate Scholars Program**. It offers undergraduates unique opportunities to get involved in research and learning related to climate change.

With scholarship funding and his own money, River has traveled across Alaska to towns and villages — Homer, Juneau, Elfin Cove, Nome, Utqiagvik and Circle. He's writing about his experiences for his Climate Scholars capstone project.

Often, he found a deep sense of community. "I was an outsider, and I would walk down the street, and they would be extremely nice to me, invite me in, offer to get me food," he said.

The idea of "coming together to fix any issue" seems a model for addressing a challenge like climate change, he said.

"I think that sometimes gets lost in other places in America — **that community sense. I think you can find it in a lot of places in Alaska.**"

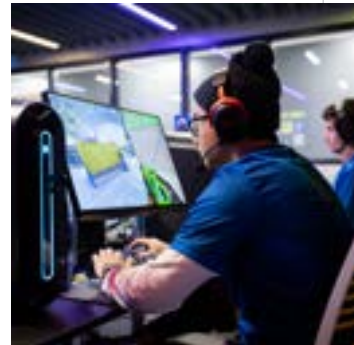
FIND YOURSELF AT AMERICA'S ARCTIC UNIVERSITY
