

The University of Alaska Fairbanks is the flagship campus of the University of Alaska System. We've got our own rocket range, an ice breaking science ship and professors who've published more Arctic research than any other university worldwide. But here, you'll find far more than science — we're enriched by a full suite of art, theater, film and language programs. It's no wonder U.S. News & World Report calls UAF a top-tier national university — the only one in Alaska. UAF leads the world in climate research and is home to the most extreme outdoor laboratory in the United States.

Every spring visiting AlaskaMester students connect and engage with the unique opportunities in Alaska for a semester-long, transformative learning experience. With a curriculum centered around Alaska's one-of-a-kind bio-geographical and cultural landscapes, AlaskaMester coursework will explore Alaska's unique natural history, natural resources, and the impact of climate change in the Arctic through a wide range of mediums. Learning tracks include Climate Activist, Field Researcher, Outdoor Explorer and Passionate Creative — or students can build their own track based on their personal interests!

Estimated Program Cost

AlaskaMester tuition varies between Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE), National Student Exchange (NSE) partners and all other schools. NSE partners are offered the Alaska resident rate. Estimated semester costs:

Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) — The WUE program allows students from western U.S. states to attend participating out-of-state colleges at a reduced tuition rate — at 150% of in-state tuition.

National Student Exchange (NSE) — The NSE program lets students study for up to a year at over 160 colleges in the U.S., Canada, and U.S. territories. Students can pay either in-state tuition at the host school or their home school's tuition. Eligibility and costs vary by institution.

Who Can Apply

- Domestic and international students of sophomore standing or higher, of any study discipline, are welcome.
- Non-U.S. citizens are welcome to apply. There are visa requirements you must complete to be admitted to the program, and regulations to follow while attending UAF. UAF staff can counsel you through the visa process.
- Graduate students are welcome to apply.
- There is no GPA requirement.
