

National Poetry Month: Irish Poetry with Ian Poole



April is national poetry month, and what better way to celebrate than highlighting verses from the lyricists of the Emerald Isle. A history of hardship coupled with breathtaking scenery and a culture of storytelling has made Ireland famous for its songs and poems. Here at the library we have a book which offers a selection of poems from over one hundred Irish poets from the 8th century to the present. The Penguin Book of Irish Verse by Brendan Kennelly is divided into three thematic parts; part one: poems translated from Irish Gaelic, part two: the Anglo-Irish poets, and part three: Yeats and after. The following three poems are some of my personal favorites and have been pulled from each part.

Anonymous, 12th or 13th century, The Blackbird by Belfast Lough

What little throat

Across the bay.
