As a queer adult who grew up with limited access to stories that represented me, I have come to find immense joy in exploring the ever-expanding world of LGBTQIA+ literature! Here are a few of my favorites that provide representation and allow anyone to see the world through diverse perspectives. Whether you're looking for romance, adventure, personal narratives, or fantastical worlds, these LGBTQIA+ books have something to offer every reader!

"The House in the Cerulean Sea" by TJ Klune

This contemporary fantasy novel has won hearts with its whimsical, heartwarming tale. The story follows Linus Baker, a caseworker for the Department in Charge of Magical Youth, who is sent to a mysterious orphanage housing magical children. Linus's journey to acceptance and love, particularly through his relationship with the charming Arthur Parnassus, is touching and uplifting.

"In Other Lands" by Sarah Rees Brennan
