The library is hosting and starting off 2023 the new year with another Project Homeless Connect in January! **This event will occur on Tuesday, January 31st, 2023 at 1-3pm at the Cultural Center**! This event is a special part of the library's outreach within the community by gathering multiple agencies to one place to provide easier access for those who need it. In addition to increasing the public's knowledge about this important issue of homelessness in Bethel.

Project Homeless Connect is an important way for people to get access to resources within the Bethel community; by hosting this event, it will feature multiple agencies whose mission is to give back to those who need it. For PHC, it is an outlet of support and services of varying kinds such as mental/physical health wellness, tribal services, employment opportunities and so much more. This event becomes a much needed result to alleviate homelessness and provide a better quality of life resources. In order to provide a successful event, we also look for donations in the forms of clothing, winter gear such as gloves, hats and jackets, bookbags, hand warmers/toe warmers, and sanitary products such as pads/tampons as well as socks for men and women! Reading Challenges for 2023

As a community, Bethel read one million pages in 2022. While the library is not doing a new challenge for 2023, you can set up your own reading challenge for this year. Here are some ideas of challenges you can take on depending on your reading style.

Easy Level

You want to take it easy this year but still want to challenge yourself to read more. Try reading 23 books in 2023. All this challenge entails is reading one book a month for the rest of the year. Another challenge for an easy level is to take book recommendations from 10 friends and read those in the year.


Medium Level

You might want a bigger challenge for 2023, but not ready to handle a major challenge. Some challenges you might want to check out are reading every book by one author, reading all the banned books of 2022, rereading 20 books from your childhood or read a book for every letter in the alphabet (title or author).

Hard Level

In 2023, you want a real challenge to take on. Here are some ideas to consider: reading all the books in your house, read one book about every item on your bucket list, read 30 classic books, pick 12 topics you want to learn more and read two books on each subject every month or read a set of books in a different genres each month i.e. Horror, Romance, Mystery or Nonfiction, Fiction, Graphic Novel.
