Library staff are so excited to annouce that we are receiving the 2023 National Medal for Museum and Library Service. The National Medal is the highest honor that a library can receive for providing excellence in service to the community. We are being recognized alongside three other libraries, and KCL is the smallest library to receive the medal this year. Thank you to Senator Lisa Murkowski for nominating us for the award for the second year in a row.

We believe that some of the factors that led to us receiving this recognition are the quantity, quality and diversity of programming that we provide to the community. We came out of the pandemic restrictions with rejuvenated energy for bringing the community together to learn, connect and celebrate. After the isolation that most of us experienced during the pandemic, we can say with confidence that the library was integral to bringing the community back together this past year. We brought several beloved authors to the community including Seth Kantner and Don Rearden. We organized the 2022 community Indigenous Peoples' Day celebration with eight hours of activities including Yuraq performances. We held an Arctic Entries storytelling event. Many of our programs went outside to teach skills that make living in Bethel a richer experience such as Wilderness Survival, Dutch Oven Gourmet Cooking, kayaking programs, and ethnobotany walks. We also held programs for marginalized community members such as Project Homeless Connect events.

Through this effort we have been involved with the Bethel Housing and Homelessness Coalition since its inception, and we are so excited that this amazing group of people have reached one of our primary goals this year as the construction began for Bethel's first Permanent Supportive Housing facility.

Many people don't realize the breadth of services that the library offers and the many ways that the library improves the lives of people in this community. We truly have something for everyone. The library is only able to provide the diverse services that we do because our community partners are always willing to collaborate. Thank you to our many community partners and to the Bethel community. It is truly an honor to serve this community.






