Alaska Book Week





Hello! As a newcomer in the Bethel community, I have met many great people so far and have witnessed a handful of events that bring the community together. Project Homeless Connect events are held annually around the country, and bring the community together to provide a multitude of services to people in need in a convenient one-stop model. In Bethel, we will be holding Project Homeless Connect on Thursday, November 10th from 11am-2pm in the Yupiit Piciryarait Cultural Center!

This event allows for 15-20 organizations in town to come together to give various services - ranging from height/weight/BMI/BP readings, screenings for TB or mental/behavioral health, providing hair-cuts, free food, and clean clothing to those who may have difficulty accessing them. Services like these are vital to assisting those in our community who may need our help.
