

Paul Sherry is a health system strategist for the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, and currently serves as the President of the Alaska eHealth Network.

He has a behavioral sciences degree from Yale University. Between 1974 and 1993 he worked with the Tanana Chiefs Conference Department of Health Services in Fairbanks, serving ten years as its director.

From 1993 to 1997 he served as Deputy Director of the Alaska Native Health Board.

He was named the first chief executive officer for the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium when it was formed in February 1998, and served as CEO until 2008. ANTHC manages statewide Native health services, including the Alaska Native Medical Center, environmental health and engineering services, community health services and business support services.

He and his wife Irene have been married for 34 years and have four children. They currently live in the home they built in the village of Minto.
