General Rules

- Alaska 4-H Code of Conduct will be enforced for all shooting sports events.
- Participants must be enrolled in shooting sports.
- Participants have one month to record their scores.
- Participants should have enough time for warm-up, practice, and the round; a rest period if needed.
- No electronic devices other than noise-canceling earmuffs (e.g., cell phones, range finders, iPods) will be permitted on the range.
- Rounds must be shot during the scheduled month and scores must be submitted electronically by the last day of the month. Results will be returned by the 5th of the following month.

Rounds

Three Position Sporter NRA Air Rifle Silhouette Sporter Air Rifle Standing

Positions

Three Position Sporter

Kneeling - 20 shots, 10 meters or 33 feet Prone - 20 shots, 10 meters or 33 feet Standing - 20 shots, 10 meters or 33 feet

NRA Air Rifle Silhouette - Standing Chicken - 10 shots, 20 yards

Pig - 10 shots, 30 yards

Turkey - 10 shots, 36 yards

Ram - 10 shots, 45 yards

Sporter Air Rifle - Standing

4 Rounds, 10 shots per round from the standing position.

Scoring

Any target line breakage will result in the higher valued score.

Awards

Awards are given by class and division.
