Officer was able to make contact with him due to shift commitments. Attempts to contact Franklin DAYTON were made by Inv. GEIER; however, those attempts met with negative results.

Sgt. KENDRICK and Det. RING conducted a second interview with George FRESE at the Fairbanks Police Department. At the conclusion of the interview, they advised that FRESE made admissions to his involvement in the assault. They also suspected Kevin PEASE and Marvin ROBERTS as being involved. They further suspected that a car owned by ROBERTS, blue two-door, may have been used.

The vehicle was described as a blue 2-door and a subsequent APSIN check revealed that a 1992 Dodge Shadow, AK LIC CNE325, was registered to Marvin ROBERTS.

INTERVIEW WITH MARVIN ROBERTS:

On 10-11-97, Sgt. KENDRICK and Inv. GEIER proceeded to ROBERTS' residence, 1031 26th Avenue, and observed ROBERTS' vehicle parked in the driveway. Contact was made with ROBERTS and he agreed to speak with officers.

ROBERTS admitted to having attended the wedding reception at the Eagle's Hall on the night of 10.10.97 through the early morning hours of 10.11.97. ROBERTS agreed to respond to the Fairbanks Police Department to speak with officers after being asked by Sgt. KENDRICK to do so. ROBERTS was advised that he could drive his own vehicle to the Fairbanks Police Department or ride with officers and ROBERTS elected to ride with officers.

While enroute to the Fairbanks Police Department, ROBERTS advised officers that he had gone to the Eagle's Hall at approximately 2300 hrs. after picking up a friend of his named Daniel HUNTINGTON. While at the Eagle's Hall, he came into contact with another friend, Angelo EDWIN, and the three of them were together throughout the evening at the Eagle's Hall. ROBERTS advised, after the reception had ended, the three of them drove around in the Fairbanks area. Subsequently they went to the Alaskan Motor Inn because they heard of a party that was going on there. ROBERTS said the party was out of hand at the Alaskan Motor Inn so they left. He then gave HUNTINGTON and EDWIN a ride home, and went home himself. ROBERTS was asked if he had driven down Barnette Street during the evening and he said "no".
