DAYTON FRANKLIN

SYNOPSIS

On 971011, between 0100-0115 hrs., FRANKLIN DAYTON was walking along the 300 block of 1st Ave., when he was assaulted by (4) subjects. DAYTON was knocked down on to the sidewalk and then kicked by the subjects. One of the subjects then took \$15.00 from DAYTON's pants pocket and then the subjects fled in a vehicle.

DAYTON was subsequently transported to FMH-ER and treated for his injuries.

During homicide investigation 97-5823, DETECTIVE RING learned that ARLO OLSEN witnessed the assault and robbery of DAYTON. He said that he was standing outside the Eagles Hall, 200 1st Ave., and saw a vehicle stop behind DAYTON. Four subjects then exited the vehicle, assaulted and robbed DAYTON, then got back into the vehicle and fled. OLSEN advised DET. RING that the subjects were ID'd as KEVIN PEASE, MARVIN ROBERTS, GEORGE FRESE and EUGENE VENT. OLSON further advised that the vehicle was a blue Dodge Shadow, owned by ROBERTS.

INVESTIGATION

On 971011, during investigation of 97-5823, LT. KELLER advised INV GEIER to investigate an assault which occurred near the Eagles Hall, FPD rad# 97054555. No patrol officer was able to make contact with the complainant due to shift commitments.

On 971012, INV. GEIER made telephonic contact with DAYTON and was briefed of the circumstances. DAYTON then responded to the FPD and was interviewed by INV. GEIER. INV. GEIER took photographs of injuries that DAYTON sustained. INV. GEIER and DAYTON went to the scene where he was assaulted, however no evidence was found.

On 971013, LT. KELLER advised INV. GEIER, that after reviewing telephone recordings from dispatch, he had located one call from FMH-ER. The call was made by RN ALICE FAYE and she was calling in reference DAYTON. She advised that after speaking with DAYTON she learned from him that a group of boys were going around jumping people and that they were going to do it again.

On 971013, INV. GEIER conducted a telephonic interview with VAUGHN REITAN. The interview was recorded.

INVESTIGATION(cont.)

On 971014, INV. GEIER interviewed KATHERINE QUIRK, DAYTON's sister, telephonically. The contact was recorded by INV. GEIER and she advised what DAYTON had told her after he was assaulted.

On 971014, INV. GEIER received a medical release form from DAYTON, authorizing release of his medical records for treatment he received at FMH-ER on 971011. INV. GEIER then obtained the records from FMH.

On 971015, DET. RING advised INV. GEIER that he had interviewed ARLO OLSEN and that OLSEN had witnessed the assault of DAYTON. See DET. RING's supplement regarding the interview.

On 971016, INV. GEIER conducted a second interview with DAYTON at the FPD. The contact was recorded by INV. GEIER. DAYTON was issued a Grand Jury subpoena for 971022 regarding this incident.

INTERVIEW WITH FRANKLIN DAYTON

On 971012, INV. GEIER interviewed FRANKLIN DAYTON at the FPD and the contact was recorded.

DAYTON advised that he left the Eagles Hall just after 0100 hrs., to catch up with some of his friends that were going downtown to drink. He said that he was walking on the sidewalk, along the south side of 1st Ave., when he heard a vehicle pulling up behind him. He thought the vehicle was turning into the parking lot (300 block 1st Ave., adjacent Golden Towers), but the next thing he heard was people directly behind him. One of the subjects then tripped DAYTON and he was shoved forward. DAYTON said that he fell to the ground, striking his right knee, right elbow and his head against the sidewalk. He attempted to push himself up, but one of the subjects stepped on his right hand. DAYTON was then kicked on the right side of his back. One of the subjects then reached into his right front pants pocket and took \$15.00 from him. DAYTON then saw there were four subjects and they got into the vehicle and fled WB on 1st Ave. DAYTON said that he laid there for a few minutes and wasn't sure if he passed out. He then walked to the Eagles Hall and contacted his sisters, KATHERINE

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QUIRK, VAUGHN REITAN and his wife, JOSIE DAYTON. DAYTON was then transported to FMH-ER for treatment of his injuries.

The only description of the suspects that DAYTON was able to provide was that the subject who stepped on his hand was wearing high top tennis shoes, which were white. He described the vehicle as a "pretty good size car" and thought it was light colored, but said it was to dark to tell. DAYTON could not remember if any of the subjects had said anything at the time. DAYTON was specifically asked if he was kicked in the head and he said he didn't remember.

During the interview, DET. RING entered the room and showed DAYTON several Polaroid photo's of suspects, but DAYTON was unable to ID anyone. DET. RING also asked if any of the suspects remarked about going to get anyone else and he said he didn't hear any.

OBSERVATIONS

While in contact with DAYTON, INV. GEIER observed that he had several injuries and subsequently they were photographed by INV. GEIER.

DAYTON had abrasions above and below his right eye that were scabbed over. Slight bruising was also present around the right eye.

DAYTON had abrasions to the back side of his right hand that were scabbed over.

DAYTON had an abrasion on his right knee.

DAYTON had a large bruise on the right side of his back, over his ribs, but closer to his right side.

INTERVIEW WITH VAUGHN REITAN

On 971013, INV. GEIER conducted a telephonic interview with REITAN. The contact was recorded.

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FRANKLIN

REITAN advised that she was at the Eagles Hall and that she was contacted by DAYTON after he was assaulted. She said that he did not say a whole lot about it, except that he was jumped by four boys and they beat him up really badly. She said that she took him to FMH along with KATHERINE QUIRK.

INTERVIEW WITH KATHERINE QUIRK

On 971014, QUIRK was telephonically interviewed by INV. GEIER. The contact was recorded by INV. GEIER.

QUIRK advised that she was contacted at the Eagles Hall by DAYTON after he was assaulted. She said that DAYTON had told her that four guys had jumped out of a car; pulled a gun on him; told him that they wanted his money and that he was not the only one that they were going to hurt. He also advised her that one of the guys was a big guy, that had thrown him down.

INTERVIEW WITH FRANKLIN DAYTON (second interview)

On 971016, INV. GEIER conducted a second interview with DAYTON at the FPD. The contact was recorded.

DAYTON told INV. GEIER about the incident as he had previously and INV. GEIER asked him some additional questions. DAYTON stated that he did not recall what he told KATHERINE QUIRK, the nurses or doctor after the incident. DAYTON was asked if remembered seeing or hearing any reference about a gun and he first answered no. DAYTON then advised that he was told not to look back and believed at that time some reference was made about a gun. He recalled that one of the suspects was a big guy and described him as being built like a football player. DAYTON was asked if he knew EUGENE VENT and he said no. DET. RING asked if he knew ARLO OLSEN and he said no. DET. RING said that OLSEN knew DAYTON as Frankie and had seen him in Kaltag. DAYTON confirmed that he had been to Kaltag and that people do call him Frankie, but didn't know OLSEN.

Dayton was asked if any of the subjects had made any sexual remarks to him and he didn't remember. He did remember one of the subjects stating words to the effect of hurry up, we have to get someone else. DAYTON did not see anyone else in the area at the time of the

The patient has an abrasion above the right eye and below the right eye with some periorbital ecchymosis but no bony instability or crepitus. Pupils are equally round

and reactive to light. Extraocular muscles are intact. Tympanic membranes are

clear and the patient has no bruising to the face.

EXTREMITIES:

The patient also has some abrasions to the knuckles of the right hand and some

mild swelling and superficial abrasions to the right knee. The patient is otherwise

Supple. Full range of motion.

LUNGS:

Clear. Regular.

HEART: ABDOMEN:

Soft.

EMERGENCY ROOM COURSE: All wounds were washed and dressed.


