Deer are the dominant herbivore in Southeast Alaska, yet critical knowledge gaps remain, which this project sought to fill using GPS-collared deer. Female deer selected habitat to meet nutritional needs and minimize predation risk in summer and against deep snow in winter. Snowfall was also a driver of population growth.

Aaron Schutt grew up in a small Alaska town but left for a big Outside university, where he once wrote home about how odd it felt to be surrounded by people and yet see no one he knew. Now back with the people he knows, Schutt leads Doyon, Limited, the regional corporation formed 44 years ago by Interior Alaska's Athabascan people. As president and CEO, he oversees the company, which owns 12.5 million acres and more than a dozen subsidiaries operating everything from oil

drills to wilderness cabins.

Mr. Schutt's ancestral roots are Koyukon Athabascan. He and his twin brother, Ethan, were adopted by teachers David and Joyce Schutt, and they grew up in Tok.

Mr. Schutt excelled at science and math in high school. He earned a bachelor's degree in engineering at Washington State University, followed by a master's in engineering and a law degree, both at Stanford University.

Returning to Alaska, Mr. Schutt worked as an attorney from 2001 to 2006, when he joined Doyon as senior vice president and chief operating officer. The Doyon board hired him as CEO in 2011.

Mr. Schutt serves on the boards of the Rasmuson Foundation, Akeela Inc. and the Alaska Native Heritage Center. He is co-chair of UAF's Troth Yeddha' Legacy Initiative fundraising committee. He also coaches youth hockey.

Mr. Schutt is married to Marissa Flannery, also an attorney, and they have two sons and a daughter. They live in Anchorage.

MS. JENNY BELL-JONES

DEPARTMENT OF ALASKA NATIVE STUDIES AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT ACADEMIC CHAIR, EMERITUS

DR. CHIEN-LU PING

PROFESSOR OF SOIL SCIENCE. EMERITUS

Dr. Ping has been a highly regarded researcher who authored numerous publications; and who has made important contributions to management and understanding of cold soils in Alaska and throughout the world, for which he received international recognition as a Fellow of the Soil Science Society of America and an invited speaker at numerous conferences.

He served on many departmental and University committees; and has been a long-term member of the National Soil Taxonomy Committee and a representative to the National Cooperative Soil Survey Program in Alaska, among numerous other national and international working groups and committees.

DR. CHANNON PRICE

Associate Professor of Physics, Emeritus

Dr. Channon Price served the University of Alaska Fairbanks with distinction in teaching, research and public service from 1987 to 2016.

He has been a highly regarded instructor who was recognized three times as Outstanding Faculty Member of the Year; has been a successful advisor and mentor to many undergraduate and graduate students; and has been active in shaping the Physics undergraduate and graduate curriculum and student assessment.

Dr. Price conducted research ranging from the field of theoretical analysis based on the standard model of the physics of young neutron stars, to numerical studies of supernova dynamics, including successfully parametrizing the Rayleigh-Taylor instability in that context, to large-scale numerical studies of both linear and nonlinear space plasma instability.

He hosted an award-winning weekly KSUA radio show for over 22 years and served as a member of the ASUAF Student Media Board — charged with the oversight of the student-run radio station, KSUA — during which time KSUA won over one hundred Alaska Broadcasting Association Goldie awards and the 2013 MTV RadioWoodie award as the top college radio station in the country.

DR. JONATHAN ROSENBERG

PROFESSOR OF POLITICAL SCIENCE, EMERITUS

Dr. Jonathan Rosenberg served the University of Alaska Fairbanks with distinction in teaching, research and public service from 1993 to 2015.

He was an outstanding teacher, earning him the Emil Usibelli Award for Distinguished Teaching; taught courses that addressed both theoretical and practical aspects of comparing regions, economies and nations; helped to design the Global Studies minor; and served as mentor and advisor to numerous undergraduate and graduate students.

Dr. Rosenberg has been an influential and wide-ranging scholar who authored journal articles, books and book chapters on the politics of oil in Alaska, comparative environmental politics, participatory environmental management in the Eastern Caribbean, Cuban political economy, Mexican parties and interest groups, and other topics.

He provided outstanding service to the department and the University; notably with his work with the Alaska Legislative internship process, which allowed dozens of University students to participate as legislative interns; membership on the Faculty Senate and many of its committees; and leadership of the General Education Revitalization Committee.

DR. JORDAN TITUS

Professor of Sociology, Emeritus

Dr. Jordan Titus served the University of Alaska Fairbanks with distinction in teaching, research and public service from 1990 to 2015.

She served as Sociology department chair for many years, served on numerous University committees, and benefitted the faculty through her union service in leading roles with United Academics.

MS. JANE WEBER

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF DEVELOPMENTAL MATHEMATICS, EMERITUS

Ms. Jane Weber has served the University of Alaska Fairbanks with distinction in teaching and University and public service from 1993 to 2016.

She has been a dedicated teacher and advisor, garnering her a Meritorious Faculty Award for Teaching excellence, a TRiO Champion Award, and five Carol Feist/Douglas Schamel Outstanding Faculty Advisor Awards; and she has furthered curriculum redesign and innovation in developmental mathematics, including establishing a developmental math lab and the Math Tutoring Hotline for rural students.

Ms. Weber notably contributed to the formation and success of the Department of Developmental Education, which she led as department chair for many years; fostered the achievement of accreditation through the National Association for Developmental Education; and served on numerous University committees, including the Committee on the Status of Women, the Student Academic Development and Achievement Committee, and the Joint Health Care Committee.

She served her colleagues in leadership roles with the University of Alaska Federation of Teachers; and helped to create the Alaska Chapter of the American Mathematical Association of Two Year Colleges.

MS. KATHLEEN WYNNE

Professor of Marine Biology, Emeritus

Ms. Kathleen Wynne served the University of Alaska Fairbanks with distinction in teaching, research and public service from 1988 to 2015.

She advised fourteen marine biology and fisheries graduate students to master's degrees.

Ms. Wynne is an outstanding researcher who has conducted wide-ranging studies of marine mammal populations and their interactions with fisheries and other human activities, and studies of the trophic interactions of marine mammals.

She authored three widely used field guides, Guide to the Marine Mammals of Alaska; Guide to the Marine Mammals and Turtles of the U.S. Atlantic & Gulf of Mexico, which won the 2000 National Outdoor Book Award: and Guide to the Marine Mammals and Turtles of the U.S. Pacific. which won the 2015 National Outdoor Book Award.

Ms. Wynne has made extensive contributions to public service, including serving in the NMFS Marine Mammal Stranding Network in Alaska and New England; serving as a member of the NMFS Alaska Scientific Review Group; and working closely with marine resource users and managers to help resolve practical problems in marine mammal interactions with fisheries.

ELIZABETH KAVRUK NICTUNE FLEAGLE

Elizabeth Kavruk Nictune Fleagle has made a second career as an invaluable mentor to students, teachers and professionals in the field of social work. Her encouragement and insights have helped hundreds of people learn to provide effective social services in Alaska and beyond. Her knowledge, dedication and

enthusiasm have earned her the respect of people across the State and Nation.

Mrs. Fleagle was born in 1935 and grew up in the village of Alatna, on the traditional boundary between her Inupiaq ancestors' territory and that of the Koyukon Athabascans. Her mother passed away when she was young, so she learned from her father, Oscar Nictune Sr. At 16, she attended Mt. Edgecumbe High School in Sitka to train as a licensed practical nurse. She worked at Fairbanks and Anchorage hospitals but then resigned to raise a family. Many years later, after experiencing an often difficult life, she returned to work with the janitorial staff at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, from which she retired in 1997.

After retirement, Mrs. Fleagle began sharing her knowledge of beading, sewing and other traditional skills as a way to reconnect young Alaska Native people with their cultures. That work grew into service as an elder-in-residence at UAF, where she has provided insights and support to students, staff and faculty in the rural human services, social work, humanities and psychology programs. She greatly enhances the academic training in behavioral treatment methods with her knowledge of Alaska Native cultures. She also attends social service conferences and workshops across the country and has helped the University of Washington start its own elders-in-residence program. Mrs. Fleagle's enthusiasm has helped many students and professionals from rural communities persevere in their classes and work. She freely offers lessons learned from her own life and encourages everyone with her smiles, laughter and optimism.

Educational, traditional and spiritual **I FADER**

TRIMBLE GILBERT

As a culture bearer, Rev. Trimble Gilbert is exceptionally knowledgeable about the Gwich'in/ Dena culture and forms a living link between the ancient ways of his people and contemporary Alaska. Throughout his long life he has freely and willingly provided leadership and support to people of Alaska's

Interior, and on a broader level as an Episcopal minister he has offered religious leadership and guidance.

Rev. Gilbert was born in Vashraii K'oo — Arctic Village — in 1935. Together with his wife, Mary, he raised three children in traditional ways. Today, he is the traditional chief of his Neets'aii Gwich'in people in Arctic Village and the second traditional chief of the Tanana Chiefs Conference. A natural and dedicated leader, he has used his position to advocate for the cultural, spiritual and physical health of his people, and is a strong proponent of both Native and Western forms of education.

Rev. Gilbert is frequently asked to teach Gwich'in traditions to children and parents throughout Alaska. A renowned fiddle player, he has tutored countless youngsters not just in music but in the power of music to overcome hardship. He offers boundless support and encouragement to young people, helping guide them to living successfully in the modern world while retaining their indigenous roots.

Through his life of service and education, Rev. Gilbert has garnered respect throughout Alaska. He is asked to provide instruction at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, where he bridges classroom learning and everyday life in rural communities, and is invited to participate in statewide meetings such as the Alaska Federation of Natives. Not least, his mentorship of young leaders demonstrates his commitment to ensuring a resilient, vibrant future for his people.

HONORARY DOCTOR OF SCIENCE



RESEARCHER, LEADER AND MENTOR

JACQUELINE A. RICHTER-MENGE

Jacqueline A. Richter-Menge is a leader in the field of polar climate physics, specializing in process studies of the Arctic sea ice cover. Her highly collaborative research, based on the Beaufort and Chukchi seas, has, among other things, contributed to the safety and efficiency of the offshore gas and oil activities in

Alaska. During the course of her career at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Cold Regions Research and Engineering Laboratory, she has led or participated in more than twenty Arctic field programs and produced more than eighty publications in the scholarly literature. Her research has greatly enhanced understanding of the physical and mechanical properties of sea ice and the techniques used to measure these properties in harsh environments.

In addition to her research, Ms. Richter-Menge has made significant contributions to the scientific community through editorships, professional society participation and committee work. She possesses a remarkable facility for seeing connections between elements in the Arctic system and engages others in interdisciplinary work. Her diplomacy and skill in negotiating with different scientific and operational cultures have been instrumental in the success of vital field and data-preservation projects. An exceptional ambassador for Arctic science, she has further used her expertise, insight and humor to convey the importance of the changing North to audiences ranging from schoolchildren to peers at government agencies.

Ms. Richter-Menge works tirelessly to develop research projects and secure funds to carry them out. Many of those projects have directly benefited Alaska by documenting changes in glaciers, sea ice and permafrost and providing data for policymakers facing crucial decisions. She also has been a supportive mentor to early-career scientists in developing successful projects and establishing professional positions, helping ensure a dynamic new generation of researchers.

CAROLYNE L. WALLACE

Mrs. Carolyne L. Wallace has been an invaluable member of the University of Alaska Fairbanks community for more than forty years. She began her affiliation with the University working in the School of Agriculture and Land Resources Management in the 1970s. She declined numerous employment opportunities over the years because of her commitment to the school, and she retired from there in 2000. During her professional tenure, she was an

energetic participant in a wide range of University committees and activities, including employee relations, fundraising and the arts. GARY R. WILKEN

Mr. Gary Wilken has blessed Alaska with his hard work and sunny disposition for more than sixty years, starting as a youth and continuing as a businessman and public servant.

Mr. Wilken arrived in Fairbanks with his family in 1951 at age five. He helped win the State basketball championship before graduating from Lathrop High School in 1964. At Oregon State University, he played

basketball and earned bachelor's and master's degrees in business. Mr. Wilken bought his father's food business, Fairbanks Distributors, in 1976 and operated it for twenty-eight years while he and his wife, Sue, raised a family in Fairbanks. He served as a Fairbanks utilities board member and then a State senator, spending a dozen years in each position. He is now on the State's industrial development corporation board.

Throughout his career, Mr. Wilken has advocated for young people and educational institutions, including the University. He spent decades on the boards of Fairbanks Youth Sports and many other organizations. Known for his thoughtful, inclusive analysis, Mr. Wilken has participated in difficult local and state decisions about policies and funding throughout his career. He continues to do so today, collecting ideas from a wide group of acquaintances.

ACADEMIC TRADITIONS

Gowns, Hoods and Mortarboards

Three types of black gowns may be distinguished in UAF's academic procession. Certificate, associate and baccalaureate gowns have long, pointed sleeves. Master's gowns have oblong sleeves with an arc cut away in the front. Doctoral gowns are faced with velvet and have bell-shaped sleeves with three bars of velvet.

UAF's master's and doctoral degree candidates will receive their hoods today, signifying they have gone beyond the bachelor's degree to a higher level of academic achievement. UAF's colors are blue and gold, and these colors line the inside of each hood. The velvet trim signifies the scholar's field of study: master of arts, white; master of business administration, drab; master of education, light blue; master of engineering, orange; master of fine arts, brown; master of science, yellow; and doctor of philosophy, dark blue.

The square Oxford cap, or mortarboard, is black and has a long tassel fastened to the middle of the top. Some colleges and universities use the soft beret, but the prevailing style of cap is the traditional mortarboard. For undergraduates receiving their first degree, the tassel is customarily worn on the right side and shifted to the left after receiving the diploma. At UAF, the black tassel is worn on the cap for all certificate, associate, baccalaureate and master's degrees, and gold tassels are worn for all doctoral degrees.

CHANCELLOR'S MEDALLION

The UAF chancellor's medallion signifies the authority vested in the chancellor. The chancellor wears a metal alloy medallion designed in 2016 by Todd Sherman, a professor of art and dean of UAF's College of Liberal Arts. The medallion features the head of a polar bear — a nanook — based on an art piece also made by Sherman that hangs in the chancellor's office. The medallion is the result of a collaboration between Sherman, computer art student Lucas Cheek '14, Rasmuson Library graphic designer Dixon Jones, and Eric Johansen '85, a mechanical technician in the College of Engineering and Mines.

University Mace

The grand marshal carries the University of Alaska mace in the commencement procession and places it in a stand on the stage during commencement ceremonies to signify the importance of the occasion. The mace was commissioned by the University of Alaska Alumni Association in honor of the university's 1967 Golden Anniversary and was created by UAF Professor Emeritus Ron Senungetuk using silver, jade and rosewood. At the top of the mace, a disk in the center of two open orbs depicts the University of Alaska seal on one side and the Alaska state seal on the other.
