Lewy will show you how to open the MacMost site and walk you through what is offered. I will be using a MacBook Pro laptop running Mac OS X High Sierra, version 10.13.3. To get us started, I have provided a list of topics from MacMost, narrated by Gary Rosenzweig. If people have questions, we can discuss the video or show it again. Our purpose is to learn. Watching lots of videos is not the point. Instead, we want to watch and learn from what we watch.

Each video includes a short description, date posted, running time, and a link to that video on the MacMost website. To watch the video, click on the image. If you have downloaded the reference materials for our course, you can click on the link in a topic to see the video.

New videos are available from MacMost every week. We will watch the most recent. I put a list of some others in the reference materials to get us started. As people become familiar with what is on MacMost, please let me know what topics interest you.

Access to the internet is available from our classroom. You can bring your own device if you like. I will use a separate connection so that I don't get locked out by network overload. Please bring headphones if you look at videos during class. The links will work outside of OLLI classrooms. I suggest you explore MacMost away from the classroom. At home is good.
