New Oven Install at Hutch

This project required removal of the existing 28 year old oven, moving the new oven which weighed almost 3000 pounds to the site at Hutch. Setting the pieces of the unit into place required eight people. Thank you to the labor crew for the help!

In addition to assembling all the parts there were plumbing, HVAC, and electrical connections

required as well as installation of the front hood vent which is installed in the ceiling. This new unit is a Model OV210E (Electric) Rack Oven. It accommodates roll-in racks and is equipped with an electronic oven control for baking and/or steaming applications. A mechanism in the ceiling of the oven rotates the entire rack for fast high capacity baking. This unit will be essential for the culinary arts program.
