Class objective: The goal of this course is for students to develop leadership and technical outdoor skills in three different areas of outdoor recreation: Outdoor Rock Climbing, Whitewater and river travel and wilderness travel. Some of the skills that will be developed are: Knots and rope handling, climbing anchors, rappelling, lead climbing, climbing group management, river navigation, river rescue concepts, down river equipment, wilderness camping, gps, map and compass navigation and backpacking. The primary class requirement is the field portion.
