## Acknowledgement of Federal Funding, Why it is Important?

Acknowledgment of federal funding is important because it publically acknowledges the contributions of the U.S. tax-payer through our federal agencies and it also is an opportunity to openly recognize our federally sponsored research achievements.

Principal investigators must review the terms of their awards to determine if the sponsor requires disclaimers or additional acknowledgments, and to determine if the sponsor requires any specific wording.

All work (publications, presentations etc...) arising from work supported by the federal government must acknowledge support by the agency and award number. Non-federal sponsors may also have requirements for acknowledgments and/or disclaimers.

Federal agencies' policy requirements set forth in Section 8136 of the Department of Defense Appropriations Act (Stevens Amendment), P.L. 100-463, enacted in October 1988 and section 511 of the fiscal year 1990 U.S. Department of Education Appropriations Act states:

"When issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with federal money, all grantees receiving federal funds, including but not limited to state and local governments, shall clearly state (1) the percentage of the total cost of the program or project which is financed with federal money, (2) the dollar amount of federal funds for the project or program, and (3) the percentage and dollar amount of the total costs of the project or program that will be funded by non-governmental sources."
