RE: Extension of Emergency Regulation - Delegation of Authority to Waive  
Credit/No-Credit Course Restrictions

The delegation refers to Credit/No-Credit course eligibility in:

- R10.04.090. Evaluation of Student Performance and Course Level Definitions
  - B. Grading Modes
    - 2. Non-academic grades (CR, NB, NC, DF, I, P, NP)
      - a. Credit/No-Credit (Student option)

Under current regulation,

*The student may elect the CR/NC option for one undesignated elective each semester during the first two weeks of the semester, with a maximum of 15 credits earned by this option applied to an Associate or Baccalaureate degree. Courses in a student's major or minor, GER/core, or specific degree requirements are not allowed under this option. If the student later changes a major or minor and the course becomes a requirement, the course may be accepted in the new major or minor at the discretion of the new department. The CR/NC option is not available for graduate courses, nor can this option be used on courses repeated for GPA improvement*

I am extending delegation made on March 20, 2020 to include the Summer 2020 semester, modifying the regulation to read (bold: addition, strikethrough: deletion):

For Spring 2020 **and Summer 2020**, the chancellors are delegated the authority to extend the CR/NC option to multiple classes, major, minor, GER/core or specific degree requirements. This option may be extended to graduate classes and for non-degree seeking students. Students may be given the option to elect the CR/NC option up to the last day of instruction.
