Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium Internships & Scholarships

Morris K. Udall Foundation 2010 Internship and Scholarship Program

The Morris K. Udall Foundation invites you to learn more about our Native American Congressional Internship Program and Undergraduate Scholarship Program.

The Internship Program is a ten-week summer internship in Washington, DC, for Native American and Alaska Native students who wish to learn more about the federal government and issues affecting Indian country. The internship is fully funded: the Foundation provides round-trip airfare, housing, per diem for food and incidentals, and a stipend at the close of the program. Interns work in congressional and agency offices where they have opportunities to research legislative issues important to tribal communities, network with key public officials and tribal advocacy groups, experience an insider's view of the federal government, and enhance their understanding of nation-building and tribal self-governance. The complete application package must be received by January 29, 2010, at the Udall Foundation.

The Morris K. Udall Scholarship is awarded to college sophomores and juniors pursuing careers related to Tribal Public Policy, Native Health Care, or the Environment. In addition to the \$5,000 financial award, Udall Scholars also get to attend the Udall Scholar Orientation and are immediately plugged into a growing and active alumni network. Tribal public policy includes fields related to tribal sovereignty, governance, law, education, justice, natural resource management, cultural preservation and revitalization, economic development, and other areas affecting Native American communities. Native American health care includes health care administration, social work, medicine, research, and other disciplines. The Foundation must receive application packets by March 2, 2010, but individual institutions may have earlier deadlines. Interested students can contact their campus' Udall Faculty Representative for more information.

University Scholarships

There are TWO sources of scholarships that students can apply to for UAF student scholarships.

- 1. UAF Privately Funded Scholarships are administered by the UAF Advancement Services office and students can apply online at https://ssl.uaf.edu/giving/forms/scholar_app.html. DEADLINE: February 15, 2010.
- 2. UA Foundation Scholarships are administered by the statewide university system for all UA students. Students can apply online at http://www.alaska.edu/foundation/scholarships/. DEADLINE: February 15, 2010.

Bristol Bay Native Corporation Education Foundation

2010-11 academic year scholarships are available. Be reminded that one must be an eligible shareholder of BBNC in order to apply and the Education Foundation selection committee reviews only once a year for these scholarship categories. (There is one exception and it is for the "Pedro Bay Scholarship" category where one must be an eligible Pedro Bay Corporation shareholder; see eligibility criteria for details.)

Applications have to be *complete and received* (<u>not postmarked</u>) by the <u>deadline date of April 2, 2010.</u> The scholarship program is competitive and limited by budget, therefore some eligible applicants may not be awarded a scholarship and there is no guarantee of funding.
