## Course Description:

Introduction to the technical and aesthetic aspects of non-linear digital video editing. Students will go from little or no experience in non-linear editing to being comfortable with some of the advanced editing techniques. Address motion picture editing theories using the Adobe Creative Cloud Suite. 3 Credits.

## Required Materials:

- USB "Jump Drive" at least 16GB or external hard-drive as below.
- Computer Access with a fast Internet Connection and **Adobe Creative Cloud** suite. Enrolled students will have access to the Media Lab outside of class hours.
- Headphones to use during class work sessions (suggested: on-ear, not in-ear). These don't have to be fabulous or expensive. They just need to work so you can work without disturbing others around you.
- **Recommended:** Portable External Hard-Drive. (suggested: USB 3, 500GB+)

## Course Goals:

Through the exploration and use of proven entertainment industry standards, to improve the technical proficiency of student videography work. Stories make a video great... the editing suite helps makes those stories watchable — or not.

## Methods:

Through both lecture/demonstration and actual production work through classtime, we will also edit those scenes as well as some previously shot works to produce finished and slick products that will be useable in portfolio (demo reel) productions.

Students will need to have access to the Internet, including Blackboard, to share course projects. A fast internet connection is extremely helpful for using the course Sound Effects Wiki library, and for viewing streaming video. Personal student computers are highly recommended.

Students will develop a video web presence and segments for a demo reel throughout the course.

## Course Policies:



**Attendance** for this course is mandatory. We will be looking and listening to various styles of work, building your visual and auditory mental library. You must be present to build that library. Any absence above 2 will begin to effect your grade in 3 point integers (-/+ letter steps). Two tardies will be equal to a single absence penalty.

**Class participation**, in production and discussions is essential to your learning, and will be part of the final grade.

**Projects are due** at the date they are assigned. Late projects will be penalized 5 points per day (not per class session). *Be on time!*
