- Often seasonal technicians
- Responsible for research objectives and making project decisions when PIs are not in camp

Critical Issues or Barriers to Completing Research Goals

- For several research groups, the 25 year old driver age requirement presented very significant barrier for completing *any* fieldwork outside of walking distance from TFS – also already presenting many issues for 2026
 - Several groups only had only 1 person allowed to drive (or 0!) - incredibly inefficient to waste someone's time just to have to drop-off or pick-up
 - Multiple instances of only one person being able to drive entire trip to/from Fairbanks – driver fatigue
 - What are the repercussions for not following the rule?
 - Do we have no choice but to hire employees over 25yo? Other options?

Traveling through Fairbanks


- Nb issues reported

How did you travel between Fairbanks (or Prudhoe) and Toolik?



How would you rate any assistance you received from the Toolik logistics office in Fairbanks?



TFS Trucks

- Overall, truck availability was limited at times

Comments:

- “Particularly at the beginning of the season, when many vehicles needed maintenance simultaneously, it was difficult to access a vehicle”
- “There was some confusion surrounding filling the TFS trucks with gas and which account to charge it to, where protocols were differently enforced than in the past, but we eventually got the truck we needed for our day trips!”
- “Also, it snowed while we were there and not all the TFS trucks had snow brushes in them”
- “I think it was unclear whether TFS trucks were available for projects that had their own PFS rental vehicles, or only available to projects that had no other vehicle option”

Driver Restrictions


Comments:

Did you use the helicopter in 2025? If so, how would you rate the helicopter vendor (Alpine Air Alaska)?



Comments:


- “Excellent job rescheduling our flight due to weather, were able to quickly reschedule us, and did their best to get us out when possible while prioritizing safety.”


TFS Housing comments

Overall, how would you rate the prepared meals at Toolik?



Food at TFS (comments or things you'd like to see)

- “jelly beans”
- “More “healthy” snack options, protein bars are very appreciated! Also more protein options in the vegetarian meals.”
- “plenty to choose from”

- “I thought the food variety and diversity was great, and I’m saying that as a veggie!”
- “Thank you for being thoughtful about prep for vegetarians – it’s nice to know you think we’d like to eat more than just noodles, and warm blobs of tofu”



Food at TFS continued..

- “The food staff is professional and courteous.”
- “thanks for the great work on providing food!”
- “...It felt like myself and others in my group were getting in trouble for things we didn't know were rules but were maybe "unwritten" rules that you learned after being up there for a bit. For the future seasons, additional signage would be good about some of these unwritten rules (i.e., only bread is allowed to touch the panini press, don't approach the back side of the buffet line during the shoulder seasons).”
- “The food is beyond excellent. I can't see how anyone could in good faith complain about it.”
- “The food was excellent!”

TFS Washeteria

- “I thought that it was kept fairly clean”
- “I am gobsmacked by the washeteria! I can't believe we get such great private showers AND get to do laundry in such great machines!”
- “It's fine, but a colossal waste of money. There really should be some hooks or shelves in the shower rooms”
- “The washeteria was very clean and served its purpose. I don't think any changes are needed.”



Watercraft

- Nb major issues with boats for research purposes
- Recreational vessels were appreciated
- Bailing boats after rain was sometimes an issue

Comments:

- “no problems were encountered”
- “I used the kayaks, and really appreciated folks taking time to get me oriented to rules and regs. I had no issues checking the kayaks in/out or finding paddles, pfds for them”
- “The only problem was that there were not enough kayak paddles by the end of the summer – one or two must have been broken or lost throughout the summer.”

Shipping to/from TFS


- “Logistics was on their game - high fives all round!”

How would you rate any field assistance or remote access assistance you received from TFS-ENVIRONMENTAL DATA CENTER?



- “You should be paid more. Remote access is invaluable to our research”

TFS Shared Equipment Requests

- “...recommend to get multiband handheld gps (better precision).”
- “It would be nice to have another set or two of larger (more size inclusive) waders / boots / gear available to borrow from the SOA”
- “It would be really nice to have land surveying equipment available, i.e. transit level and rod.”
- “A dry suit might also be a nice addition to the gear closet, although I realize they’re quite expensive.”

TFS Website, SRS System

- “Difficulties when a reservation uses a project truck, and then wants a back up of the toolik shuttle”
- “Making and changing reservations was a bit trying at times, which led to some frustration and consternation, for all parties, I’m sure”
- “I think the myToolik reservation page is a little clunky to use. One small change that would make it a lot more user-friendly is a calendar view of reservations. Now all the reservations for a given project are tabular, which makes them a little tricky to keep straight. A visual representation of arrivals/departures would be useful (something along the lines of a gantt chart).”

Other Comments and Future Directions

- Honestly, its such a treat to have all the amenities Toolik provides while doing research. Yall make it so that arctic research can happen, and I'm really grateful for all that you do! Thank you for everything!"
- "I get the sense the staff at the station feel misunderstood and undervalued a bit. It is concerning to me and other researchers I've spoken with that there has been so many staff leaving, albeit for a variety of reasons. But, it's tough times for science I realize."
