KNOWLEDGEABLE IN TRADITIONAL WAYS

- Translator to communicate English to Yup'ik or vice versa.
- Community service can be done by hunting moose, seals or birds, gathering plants or berries, cooking for grieving families, chopping wood, gather wood, or doing household chores.
- Tribal Court Developed Out of Necessity: remote village with our own set of unique problems and needs.
- Cases we've handled: elder abuse, juvenile delinquency, child custody cases or misdemeanor cases when they break the village rules.
- Help families when they have problems within their homes.
