# **Course Description:**

Establishes a basic skill and knowledge set for personnel assigned wildland fire prevention responsibilities. Includes training in sound wildland fire observations and scene of origin protection practices that will enable learners responding to a wildland fire to preserve crucial fire cause and spread indicators. An introduction to Alaskan wildland fire prevention statutes and regulations, and enforcement procedures will be included. This course is based on National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) courses.

#### Course Goals:

Successful course completion combined with national age, physical fitness and appropriate experience requirements as administered by a federal or state wildland fire agency will qualify the student for interagency fire qualification certifications.

## **Prerequisites:**

FIRE 151 or Instructor permission

The successful student will be able to:

Demonstrate the skills and knowledge necessary to perform the field applications of the basic fundamentals of wildland fire prevention.

- Wildland Fire Prevention Administration
- Wildland Fire Prevention Education
- Wildland Fire Prevention Engineering
- Wildland Fire Prevention Enforcement

List various causes of wildland fires and their cause indicators.

Perform the basic procedures and techniques needed to provide witness/observer information to fire investigators.

Identify and protect wildland fire origin areas.

Appreciate Alaskan wildland fire prevention statutes and regulations. Articulate established law enforcement procedures.

#### Methods:

The course is presented by short lectures, electronic presentations, exercises, and class discussion. Group discussion is strongly encouraged. Homework assignments, periodic quizzes and unit finals will document student progress.

#### **Instructor Qualifications:**

Instructors must have experience in wildland fire investigation and a wide range of wildfire prevention knowledge to facilitate group and class interaction and discussion.
