A. CHANGE IN DEGREE REQUIREMENTS: (Brief statement of program/degree changes and objectives)

For several years, paralegal has been offered as a minor for students seeking a four-year degree. It requires a total of 18 credits. The paralegal minor is the best choice for students planning to enter law school after earning a B.A. in disciplines such as justice or political science, because the paralegal program focuses on practical skills required of law students, such as computer-assisted legal research, drafting legal pleadings and documents, and working with the rules of court. The courses are taught by lawyers and paralegals, many actively practicing in Fairbanks. However, many students elect other minors, such as "Law and Society," because they require only 15 credits and students, in addition, can often use courses they have already completed as part of the major requirements for their four-year degree. To continue to be a logical and attractive minor area of concentration for UAF students interested in the law, and especially those seeking to enter law school, the paralegal minor, in order to be "competitive," needs to be reduced from 18 to 15 credits.

## JUSTIFICATION FOR ACTION REQUESTED

The purpose of the department and campuswide curriculum committees is to scrutinize program/degree change applications to make sure that the quality of UAF education is not lowered as a result of the proposed change. The paralegal program is frequently made aware that students who have earned the associate degree in paralegal, or who have used paralegal as their minor, that this is a wise choice for students planning to attend law school or enter a law-related profession. The program has letters and comments from students and graduates which strongly assert the value from their paralegal training at UAF. Nevertheless, some students are missing the opportunity to gain from the benefits of learning hands-on, practical skills which will be valuable upon entering law school, or a law-related occupation, because of their short-sighted decision to pursue a less rigorous minor. Reducing the paralegal minor to 15 credits will allow students to make a decision based on factors other than the minimally smaller number of credits required.
