We anticipate an increase in student enrollment, which can be accommodated with current classrooms and facilities.

#### F. IF MAJOR CHANGE - ASSESSMENT OF THE PROGRAM:

The general BA in Music degree and each of the concentrations in Music Theory, Music History and Music Composition have MUS F476 Senior Project as a capstone course for program outcome and assessment. The 100-200 level music courses are sequential sets of academic and performance-based courses, which serve as a music "core" required for all majors. Outcomes and assessments for the core music courses (1. – 5.) are organized by specific skill sets: 1. Theoretical Knowledge; 2. Historical Knowledge; and 3. Applied Knowledge. Each set has comprehensive outcome-based testing throughout the course sequences. Upper-division music courses (4. Major Focus) emphasize a synthesis of knowledge and skills in more advanced topics. Courses have comprehensive outcome-based testing and also serve as preparation for undertaking the Senior Project.

#### JUSTIFICATION FOR ACTION REQUESTED

The purpose of the department and campus-wide curriculum committees is to scrutinize program/degree change applications to make sure that the quality of UAF education is not lowered as a result of the proposed change. The Department of Music intends to strengthen and diversify its BA in Music degree program, as per recommendations stated in the most recent BA Music Program Review. The Program Review noted that the current BA in Music has served as less of a defined program and more of a "holding tank" for students intending to move to BMus programs in Performance and Music Education, and that the current BA lacks specific and differentiated program objectives and outcomes. The proposed major changes would: 1) clarify student learning outcomes and assessments; 2) add a needed capstone course (MUS F476) to the program (Format 1- New Course has been submitted along with this Major Change proposal); and 3) expand the BA program to include three specific concentration areas, thereby providing students with program options that suit a variety of aptitudes, career objectives and post-baccalaureate opportunities. The Department anticipates that these major changes to the BA will improve the quality of the program and serve to attract students who have interest in these newly-offered areas of concentration. There are other BA programs at UAF that utilize the concentration format (e.g. Alaska Native Studies, Fisheries), and Jayne Harvie (Coordinator, Faculty Senate Office) has indicated that the proposed changes do fall under Major Changes and do not constitute proposing a new program (see attached email).

Explanation of proposed changes (as listed by catalog number): 1. All music students already audition for acceptance as music majors, however, this has not been stated previously in the requirements. 3. The keyboard skills program has been updated and no longer requires a placement test. All students now complete a sequence of Functional Piano courses (MUS F152-154, 253). 5. Changes from MUS F362 to MUS F262 represent dropping two semesters of required private lessons and large ensemble for BA students. The 300-level lessons are intended for preparing students for Junior Recital in Performance and Music Education degrees. There is no recital requirement in the BA. These six "saved" credits have been reapplied to elective course blocks where students now have more credits and options for a broader base of study. More advanced performers in the BA may still choose to take 300-level lessons and additional large ensembles as electives. Changes to course titles for MUS F131/132, MUS 221/222, MUS 231/232 reflect minor course changes previously submitted for the AY2015-16 catalog. Change to course title for MUS F332 is a correction-- matching the course title currently in the 2014-15 catalog course description. Additions to italicized notes \*\* + and ++ are made to clarify specific requirements. The current BA is now referred to as General BA in Music, with the addition of three BA in Music concentrations (Music Theory, Music History, Music Composition). Each BA area requires a Senior Project as a program outcome. Each concentration requires 15 credits in a specific concentration and 12 additional elective credits. As is the case with the current BA, all proposed BA options require a minor area of study and a minimum of 120 credits (see attached 4-Year Plans for each BA area).

Hi Jayne,

In response to our Department's recent program review, the Music Department following recommendations to make our BA in Music degree more specific, with improved outcome goals and assessments. We are planning on changes that I thought I would run by you first to see if these fit the context of Major Program changes and not "new program" which would be a much more long-term, intensive process.

Currently our BA is general-- just BA in Music. We intend to add specific emphasis areas within the BA Music, such as Music Theory emphasis, Music History emphasis, Music Composition emphasis. These would entail taking existing courses and making various combinations of courses required or elective depending on the particular area. The total number of credits would be unchanged from the current requirement (120 minimum), and all BA students would complete the same core music requirements at 100-200-- level before taking courses in their particular emphasis area. In addition, we want to add one new course-- a MUS 476 Senior Thesis (3 credits), something that doesn't exist in our current general BA, but something that is needed for a stronger outcome assessment.

Given that we are not changing credit totals and are not deleting the current general BA-- only adding emphasis areas within overall BA program, can this proceed as Major Program change?

Thank you for any insight and recommendation you can provide.

Everything you've described does fall under the major program change "umbrella" (and not new program).

A question that occurred to me is whether the emphases you have described are just that, or whether they are concentrations -- the answer depends upon what you want for students in terms of the degree. I called Holly and brought up my question about that to her since I am not clear on all the differences between the two terms and their ramifications. I'm cc'ing her on my reply as she can better describe what the differences are in terms of the technicalities for student transcripts and DegreeWorks. (A quick example: a concentration actually appears on the student transcript, whereas an emphasis does not.)

(Also, by cc'ing her she can read your email. Thanks for your help, Holly.)
