In response to Special Program Review, Provost Henrichs has approved the Department of Theatre & Film's Improvement Plan which involves a major curricular overhaul. We are taking our two separate BA degrees, Theatre (THR) and Film (FLM), and combining them to create one BA in Film & Performing Arts, with the new course designator: FLPA.

We are expanding the current Film BA degree and phasing out our Theatre BA degree. We will maintain minors in both Theatre and Film.

Because we don't want to lose students interested in Theatre, we would like the "Theatre" section of the catalog to remain with information about the Theatre Minor and with a note to see the "Film and Performing Arts (Theatre Track)" BA section of the catalog for major information.

Both the Theatre and Film programs housed within the Department of Theatre and Film contribute substantially to the departmental mission of providing training in the discipline of the Dramatic Arts. We propose an expansion of the Film BA to include a track in "Theatre" while we phase out the Theatre BA. This innovative restructuring at the departmental level will yield the most fruitful results in terms of attracting new majors, retaining current majors and minors in both Theatre and Film, increasing class enrollments, producing graduates in a timely manner, and cutting costs.

## E. IMPACTS ON PROGRAMS/DEPTS:

Provost Henrichs has approved this curriculum overhaul as part of our approved Improvement Plan submitted in December 2015 as part of the Special Program Review process.

The Theatre and Film programs are affected by this shift. All of our former FLM and THR courses that were cross-listed with other departments such as Journalism, Art, and English

still will be as FLPA courses cross-listed with other departments. By maintaining our strong relationships with Alaska Native Studies, Anthropology, Art, English, Foreign Languages, Journalism, History and Northern Studies, we will continue to support the interdisciplinary approach to film *studies* while maintaining a curriculum for *film production and performance* within our own department.

## Film & Performing Arts (FLPA) Core

1. All FLPA majors will take the FLPA core which will be introductory courses that train students in the fundamentals of Film and Performing Arts, focusing on what the art forms share. Our students will benefit from a small selection of courses that will provide an overview of each of the major elements of producing and performing in both film and theatrical productions. Because all of our FLPA majors (currently 64) will be required to take all FLPA core classes, we anticipate strong enrollment in all three core classes: Fundamentals of Acting, Introduction to Production Design, and Film Set Production I. From this core, students will be able to choose one of two major tracks to achieve their BA.

## Two Tracks

- 1. Film Track: This is a streamlined, tighter version of the current Film program. We are focusing on eliminating under-enrolled electives, allowing the faculty to concentrate on teaching a reduced set of courses that will have higher enrollments on a more regular basis. We have reduced the number of the upper division electives options to help focus students on their specific area of specialization.
- 2. Theatre Track: This is a major departure from the current Theatre program. The Theatre Track will emphasize performance classes and eliminate under-enrolled upper division design courses and, as a cost saving measure, courses taught by faculty who no longer work at UAF (Marx, Cook).

Historically, 90% of our Theatre majors are actors, so we are removing the *Design/Technical* and *Directing* tracks of the discipline and modifying the *Performance* track to reduce choice and consolidate classes to further boost enrollment. For example, THR 320 *Voice & Speech for the Actor* and THR 221 *Acting II* will now become one class.

We are eliminating most of the upper divisional design and directing courses: THR 447 Lighting II, THR 348 Sound Design, THR 343 Scenic Design, THR 456 Advanced Costume Design and Construction, and THR 432 Directing II. By eliminating under-enrolled courses, the remaining faculty are available to teach more film courses which are

enjoying growing enrollment. As we continue to attract students interested in design and directing, we will focus their course of study through the remaining design/directing courses along with Topics in Film or Stage Production (FLPA 481), Research (FLPA 498), Practicum (FLPA 401/402), and Thesis (FLPA 499). This consolidation and restructuring will allow us to retain most of our current Theatre majors while boosting overall enrollment in our BA by offering the *only program in the state* where director, actors, and designers can study to work on both stage and screen.

# Increased Practicum/ On-Set Emphasis:

To help the Department cope with the reality of fewer faculty assisting with the production process, we are increasing the Theatre Practicum credits required from students, including specifying some as FLPA 402 *Technical Practicum*, believing this will help us maintain the quality of our productions. We are also adding FLPA 403 *FRAME*, which places students on commercial film sets, as a requirement within the Film Track.

In both the Theatre and Film/Video areas, our programs have excelled by providing our students many hands-on opportunities on productions, both live performances and films, leading to our students being prepared to find work in the field immediately after college. We plan to continue this practice, and will continue to excel in the areas of practical application in support of material learned in formal classroom settings.

## Minors:

Many of our current Theatre majors minor in Film, and many of our Film majors minor in Theatre. We want to keep both Theatre and Film Minors so that FLPA students in the Film Track can still minor in Theatre and FLPA students in the Theatre Track can still minor in Film Studies. Maintaining both minors in Film Studies and Theatre will also allow students across campus to continue to minor in Film Studies or Theatre. Over the past decade we have graduated 61 minors.
