We contacted Mary Pete at Kuskokwim Campus to see if she had any desire for us to keep this course on the books. Email response is attached indicating she is in agreement with us dropping this course.

This action is unlikely to affect any other courses, programs or departments. Spring of 08 at KUC was cancelled due to zero enrollment. Prior to that, KUC offered it in spring 04 with 5 students and in spring of 02 with 4 students. This course is not required for graduation and does not seem to attract much enrollment when it is offered.

13. JUSTIFICATION FOR ACTION REQUESTED

The purpose of the department and campus-wide curriculum committees is to scrutinize course change and new course applications to make sure that the quality of UAF education is not lowered as a result of the proposed change. ANS 275 was developed sometime prior to 1994. DANSRD has never offered the course and has no plans to do so in the future. The subject matter is highly specialized and we have no faculty who would be qualified to really teach this course well. Last time the course was offered by KUC (in 2008) it had zero enrollment and was cancelled. Two earlier offerings were taught with very low enrollment. We feel that elective courses we offer at the 200 level need to appeal to a fairly broad

range of students in order to get acceptable enrollment. A coron just one of Alaska's Native cultures does meet that criteria
