A. CHANGE IN DEGREE REQUIREMENTS: (Brief statement of program/degree changes and objectives)

We are seeking to reduce the total credits required for the B.S. in Anthropology from 130 credits to 120 credits. This does not require changing the major requirements, it simply reflects a reduction in the number of general electives the student is required to take. As it stands, after meeting the Core, B.S., and major requirements, B.S. students in anthropology must take an additional 44-45 elective credits. Reducing the total credits required for the degree to 120 will simply reduce that number of elective credits to 34-35. This should allow B.S. students to complete their degrees in a timely manner.

However, a reduction in the overall number of credits for the degree (from 130 to 120) will reduce the total number of credit hours being taken by B.S. students in anthropology.

As discussed above, we are not changing the major requirements (which currently stand at 36 credits), but rather are requesting to reduce the number of credits required for the B.S. degree from 130 to 120. The only impact this will have on the students is that they will now take 34-35 general elective credits instead of needing 44-45. This should allow students to finish in a timely manner and could help draw more students to the program. In fact, the current requirement of 130 credits appears to reflect a mistake on the part of the department; when the major requirements were increased from 30 to 36 credits several years ago, the department simply increased the overall credit requirement to 130, not realizing that the number of general elective requirements should have been reduced so as to avoid increasing the overall credits required for the degree.
