A. Grading System and Grade Point Average Computation --current

“All course grades are letter grades unless otherwise specified in the class schedule. The method of grading (letter or pass/fail) is an integral part of the course structure and is included in the course description. Instructors are expected to state their grading policies in writing at the beginning of each course. Grades appearing on academic records are:

A An honor grade, indicates originality and independent work, a thorough mastery of the subject and the satisfactory completion of more work than is regularly required.

B Indicates outstanding ability above the average level of performance.

C Indicates a satisfactory or average level of performance.

D The lowest passing grade, indicates work of below-average quality and performance.

F Indicates failure. All F grades, including those earned in pass/fail courses, are included in the GPA calculations.”

A, including + and – : A grade of “A” indicates a thorough mastery of course content and outstanding performance in completion of all course requirements.

B, including + and - : A grade of “B” indicates a high level of acquired knowledge and performance in completion of course requirements.

C, including + and - : A grade of “C” indicates a satisfactory level of acquired knowledge and performance in completion of course requirements.

D, including + and - : A grade of “D”, the lowest passing grade, indicates a minimal level of acquired knowledge and minimal performance in completion of course requirements. It is generally not accepted to satisfy requirements in certain majors and in graduate programs.

F: A grade of “F” indicates failure to meet a minimal level of understanding of course content and/or performance in completion of course requirements.
